The Tomorrow River Scholarship Foundation (TRSF) is pleased to announce the following scholarships available to residents of the Tomorrow River Community who plan to pursue a post-high school education. Applicants must be enrolled or intend to enroll in an accredited university or technical school, pursue a program of one year or more, and carry at least twelve (12) credits a semester.

Applicants must submit the following information to the Tomorrow River Scholarship Foundation:

- Application form
- Recent personal essay of at least 250 words in which the applicant tells us where they hope to be in five years.
- Transcript(s) of high school and/or college courses
- Recommendation form filled out by a non-related adult referent (recent high school/college educator, school counselor, employer, pastor, etc.) The recommendation form can be found on the school website. Send the recommendation form to your referent and ask your referent to email the completed form to amherstscholars@gmail.com.
- A head-and-shoulders photo of the applicant to be used in a Community Spirit article.

Scholarship recipients will be chosen by the TRSF Board of Directors based on a variety of criteria including but not limited to: scholastic ability/achievement, extra-curricular and volunteer activities, work experience, financial need, one recommendation, and a personal essay. Applications must be submitted online only by no later than **February 16, 2020**. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.

- Welton Alm Scholarship**
- Amherst Area E.M.S. Scholarship ***
Awarded to an individual who plans to pursue post-high school education in an area related to emergency medicine at an accredited university or technical school, pursue a program of one year or more, and carry at least 12 credits or full time status per semester. Your essay should include reasons for entering the field.
- Amherst Coaches Club Scholarship**
Awarded to a student with a minimum 2.5 GPA who is pursuing a degree in a 'helping profession' that nurtures the growth of or addresses the problems of a person's physical, psychological, intellectual, emotional or spiritual well-being.
- Amherst Fire Fighters Scholarship**
Awarded to an individual planning to pursue a post high school education in firefighting, emergency medical, or healthcare services profession. Applicants should have a least a 2.0 GPA and be enrolled or intend to enroll for full time status as indicated by an accredited institution or at least 12 credits. Community service will be given weighted consideration.
- Amherst Youth Wrestling Scholarship**
Awarded to a student active in wrestling
- Charles and Helene Anderson Memorial Scholarship**
- Terry Anderson Community Scholarship**
Awarded to a student with a high level of school and community involvement.*
- Eleanor Bartig Memorial Scholarship**
Awarded to a student with a minimum of 5 years of 4-H participation and continuing education in either agriculture or "domestic engineering" which could include early childhood development and parent education.
- Burton Benjamin Scholarship**
Awarded to a student going into aviation or a field that requires a pilot's license.

- Walter Bohman Scholarship**
Awarded to an individual who has maintained a 3.7 GPA in college prep courses.
- Jerry and Rosemary Borgen Family Scholarship**
Awarded to an individual who, through self-help, has continually improved himself/herself and others with hard work, determination and creativity, in effect making the most of one's gifts to better mankind. This scholarship shall consider situations where the recipient has "turned around" his/her life and that of others.

Awarded to a student with a 3.25 GPA and is pursuing chemical, biological, mechanical, electrical, or industrial engineering or a Doctor of Pharmacy

Awarded to a college sophomore or greater in the UW system with a proven academic record

Awarded to a student who has been active in student government.

Awarded to an individual who plans to go into a profession that involves working with children, with preference to those pursuing speech-and-language pathology.*

Awarded to an individual who is going into a field designed to help children with special needs.

Awarded to a student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 pursuing a career in natural resources, a health field, or education.

Awarded to a current senior who has lettered in at least one varsity sport.

Awarded to a graduate with a minimum GPA of 3.0 who is pursuing education to become a registered nurse in Wisconsin, Iowa, Illinois, or Indiana.

Awarded to a student going into the medical profession.
- Walter and Carla Leppen Memorial Scholarship***
- Anthony and Stella Loftis Memorial Scholarship****
- Richard Lutz Memorial Scholarship**
Awarded to a student going into a field related to agriculture.
- Page-McKenzie Scholarship**
Awarded to a graduating senior or alumni with Dyslexia and/or Learning Disability pursuing higher education in a degree program.

- Jon Schlutter Memorial Scholarship**
Awarded to a student who has maintained at least a 2.5 GPA and has been in a Whitetail Lanes junior or high school bowling program. Your essay should state what bowling means to you.
- Ruth Schmatz Memorial Scholarship**
Awarded to any incoming freshman college student or first-year technical school student. Essay (or an additional essay) should talk about an influential teacher in the applicant's life.
- Mark and Sandra Lynne Schmutzler Family Scholarship**
- Guy Scudella Memorial Scholarship**
Awarded to a student involved with and pursuing an education in art, music, or drama.

- George & Susan Sroda Scholarship**
Awarded to a college junior or senior with at least a 3.0 GPA. The student who receives this scholarship must be present at the banquet in early June to be eligible to receive the money.
- Kayla Joy Toelle Scholarship**
Awarded to a student pursuing a degree in education, with preference to those enrolled in elementary education or early childhood.

Awarded to an individual who has a record of community service.

Awarded to a graduating senior with a minimum GPA of 2.5 who was involved in the program for at least one full year and participates in any school sanctioned sport as a senior
